**OUR MISSION**  
 To create a comfortable home environment - a key element in the struggle to stabilize homeless individuals and the poor, and break the cycle of falling in and out of housing.

**The facts are compelling!**

- **More than 500,000 Americans are still homeless on any given night, with scarce resources to utilize once they get their first transitional housing**
- **Millions more live in over-crowded temporary housing**
- **The elderly, with many on subsistence support, are some of the hardest hit**
- **Children and families represent the fastest growing segment of our homeless population**

When our families are at last offered affordable housing, a harsh reality confronts them – their house is empty. Without beds, dressers, living room furniture, kitchen tables and chairs as well as other basic furniture, their house is not home. Unfortunately, once rent and utilities are paid and food and childcare provided, there is little left for these furnishings. A family’s confidence and hope for success are dealt a serious blow as they lie down on a cold, hard floor. Consider the everyday luxuries that most of us take for granted, but which make our lives much easier. A soft, clean bed to sleep in, refreshing us for work in the morning... an inviting desk that encourages our kids to succeed in school... a kitchen table offering a cozy place for our families to gather and communicate. These are the essential items that The Furniture Co-Op works to provide to all families in the Greater New Haven area. These families simply do not have the resources to buy furniture during their transition, no matter what the cost.

## Mission

Each year, hundreds of homeless people in the Greater New Haven area succeed in transitioning from the streets and shelters into permanent housing. Unfortunately, after spending all of their meager savings on deposits and rent, many of these newly housed people have no money left over to buy furniture.

For some, including children, seniors, and people with AIDS, this situation is a serious health risk that can have deadly consequences. For everyone, having no furniture means uncomfortable home surroundings and poor sleep for nights on end. This can be a critical problem for adults and children who are struggling to succeed at work, in training, or at school.

To meet this need, and help homeless people on the road to self-sufficiency, The Furniture Co-Op was formed in 2007. The Furniture Co-Op is the only program that systematically provides this service in the Greater New Haven area. With a pick-up service, The Furniture Co-Op makes it easy to “recycle” used but usable furniture.

The Furniture Co-Op helps over 500 families each year create a healthy, comfortable home environment for themselves. Each year The Furniture Co-Op helps many groups in need including:

- Homeless moving into permanent housing
- Women and children fleeing domestic violence
- People diagnosed with HIV/AIDS
- Senior citizens
- People with disabilities.

More than half of the people served by The Furniture Co-Op are children.

Through grants and financial donations, along with the donation of furniture from the public, The Furniture Co-Op helps people create a healthy comfortable home environment – a key element in the struggle to stabilize homeless individuals and families and break the cycle of falling in and out of housing.

Since 2007, The Furniture Co-Op has built a network of collaborative partnerships that include more than 20 other local non-profit agencies. These member agencies participate by making furniture requests on behalf of their clients and soliciting furniture donations for The Furniture Co-Op.

## **The Furniture Co-Op creates long-term community benefits**

**Environmental:** Offers a pick-up service for donors to dispose of furniture they no longer need, allowing those items to be recycled to families in transition for further use. Since 2007, The Furniture Co-Op has diverted thousands of pounds of items from area landfills.

**Financial:** Helps displaced and homeless people stay within their budget and re-stabilize in a home of their own.

**Dignity:** Furniture transforms empty housing into a home, and a home provides a basic foundation of rest and comfort which is essential for success at work and school.

**Health:** Creates a more sanitary home environment for eating and sleeping, to help prevent sickness and disease.

**Social:** Promotes family interaction because people have a dining table and other items that provide a location for gathering and conversations (Imagine Thanksgiving Day without a dining table or Super Bowl Sunday without a sofa).
